- 3 weeks trip \$2,450 (or \$2,150 if registered by July 31) (Airfare not included.)
- A deposit of \$500 is required at time of registration.
- Full payment must be received prior to departure. Payment may be made by cashier's check, money order, personal check, or cash.
- Full payment must be received prior to departure unless there is an approved payment plan.

Day 6-7 Stay home (drumming, cultural learning)

Day 7-9 Visit waterfall under rainforest in Kindia

Day 9-10 Visit Les Ballets Africains (the national dance and drum company which Mamady worked for)

Day 10-11 Visit National Museum

Day 11-12 Visit local market for shopping

Day 12-13 Stay home (drumming, cultural learning)

Day 13-14 Visit Sumba, another waterfall in Dubreka

Day 14-15 Stay home (drumming, cultural learning)

Day 16 Departure.

Beyond 16 days to three weeks, the cultural experiences continue. Dancing is optional.




